• We gather information about significant difference in attainment between girls and boys, and between pupils of different ethnic backgrounds.

Analysis of the Summer 019 data shows that;

- o EAL pupils achieved a better GLD than Non-EAL pupils at the end of EYFS
- o *EAL pupils* achieved broadly in line with All children in Reading, writing and maths at the end of key stage 1
- o Children from the BAFR group achieved well in all year groups

- o Children from the WOTH and WBRI did not achieve as well as other groups in all years
- o Girls outperformed boys in all year groups
- o Pupils in receipt of PPG performed less well than others
- o Pupils at SEND support made progress broadly in-line with other pupils
- o Pupils with EHCP's made less progress than SEND support
- Thorough data analysis of all groups across each year group has taken place to inform action and targets for the next academic year.
- The Inclusion Leader has special responsibility for equality matters. The Head teacher monitors the progress and has overall responsibility.
- Pupil Premium money is targeted to individuals and specific groups. Further detailed information can be found under the Pupil Premium section of the website.
- There are clear procedures for dealing with prejudice-related bullying and incidents

Objectives:

- The areas for development arising from our analysis of the Summer 019 data have formed part of our school improvement plan.
- We will continue to focus on raising achievement for all underachieving groups of children
- We will continue to help our vulnerable families to access as wide a range of resources and support as possible by delivering some of this support at school.
