This month has seen the school celebrate NSPCC Number Day and Online Safety Day. These are both important curriculum events.

Well done to the children for their creativity in dressing up for **Number Day.** The day was spent taking part in fun maths challenges as well as raising awareness of the NSPCC.

Online Safety is particularly important with our children's use of technology nowadays. During Online Safety Day, we teach the children how to use the internet safely. We do remind them during their Computing lessons of the importance of keeping their passwords to themselves.

Writing Update

Writing has been a key focus for the school for the past three years now. It was also one of the areas of development from the school's last inspection. For many schools, writing is an area for development, one of the reasons being that children often do not choose to write with technology being so available nowadays.

At Elmwood Infant School, staff have worked hard under the leadership of Mrs Murphy and Miss Payne to improve writing by making the whole process a lot simpler. We are focusing on our children being confident in writing a range of sentences and being able to punctuate them with capital letters and full stops. For our younger children the focus is on leaving spaces between words, which we call 'finger spaces'. We teach the children that this will help people read what they have written.

This year we have introduced a new handwriting program called Letter Join, as we noticed that children were not forming letters correctly.

To help your child with their writing at home, try using these simple tips:

- \checkmark Say their sentence before they write it
- \checkmark Leave finger spaces between words so it can be read by you
- ✓ Encourage correct letter formation Do not write their names in capital letters

In March's Newsletter, we will give you an update on our progress with our next key priority: Developing Vocabulary

Attendance and Punctuality Update

Our current whole school attendance percentage is now 93.39% (excluding Nursery). This is an improving picture. However, we do still have an issue with our punctuality.
